On February 29, 2016, the application for Achieve Community Charter School was approved. Pursuant to *N.J.A.C. 6A:11-2.1(k)*, the approval for the granting of the charter was contingent upon satisfying the conditions of the preparedness visit process conducted by representatives of the New Jersey Department of Education (Department) and receipt of any outstanding or additional documentation requested.

It is my pleasure to inform you that the above-referenced contingencies have been satisfied; therefore, I am granting a charter to the Achieve Community Charter School. The charter term will cover the period from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2021. Pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 18A:36A-1 et seq.* and *N.J.A.C. 6A:11-1 et seq.*, the granting of this charter permits your school to open and function as a public school, within the Newark Public School District, in accordance with your approved application.


