Dear Mr. Piscal:

On September 30, 2016, the application for the College Achieve Greater Asbury Park Charter School was approved. Pursuant to *N.J.A.C. 6A:11-2.1(k)*, the approval for the granting of the charter was contingent upon satisfying the conditions of the preparedness visit process conducted by representatives of the New Jersey Department of Education (Department) and receipt of any outstanding or additional documentation requested.

It is my pleasure to inform you that the above-referenced contingencies have been satisfied; therefore, I am granting a charter to the College Achieve Greater Asbury Park Charter School. The charter term will cover the period from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2021. Pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 18A:36A-1 et seq.* and *N.J.A.C. 6A:11-1 et seq.*, the granting of this charter permits your school to open and function as a public school, within the Asbury Park and Neptune Public School Districts, in accordance with your approved application.

During the preparedness period, the charter school applied for a waiver that would provide extended time to submit required documentation for the 508 3rd Avenue, Asbury Park, NJ facility. The charter school must comply with the terms detailed within the Department approved waiver (enclosed). The school must submit the appropriate certificate of occupancy, sanitary inspection report and fire inspection certificate to the Monmouth County Office of Education on or before August 7, 2017. A successful site visit from the Monmouth County Office of Education is also required prior to the admittance of students.


Subsequent to this letter you will receive your Charter Agreement, which sets forth the terms and conditions of operating a charter school in New Jersey and will also contain accountability criteria by which the charter school will be evaluated. Please sign the Charter Agreement, pass a board resolution and send a copy of the contract to njcharter@doe.state.nj.us by September 1, 2017.
